Please, Slow Down!!!

Those of you who drive through the downtown core area of Beaver Creek are as aware as I am about the inherent risks in doing so! Some people seem to think that the posted 35 MPH doesn't apply to them! Well, on Tuesday evening, November 14, 2000, at about 8:37 p.m. the unthinkable happened. There was a head on collision in front of the "Corner Park" when one of the vehicles crossed the center line and hit the other.

The vehicles involved were a 1998 Ford Escort, driven by Tony Windon of Canby, born in 1968, who was coming into the Beaver Creek area from the direction of Oregon City. Tony also had as a passenger in his car, his son, Anthony, age 3, who was thank goodness, in the right rear in a child restraint seat.

Tony Windon had to be life-flighted from the scene to a Portland area hospital and as of Wednesday, November 29, 2000, he was still in a coma, but is responding to his wife during her visits. His son Anthony was thankfully not injured.

The other vehicle, a Chevy 4X4 pickup, driven by Jeff Crites, of Portland, born 1962, was heading in the opposite direction. The pickup ended up on its side in the road. The driver received a cut on his hand. The truck, adjusted 6" higher than normal factory specs, caused substantial damage to the Windon vehicle.

According to Bob Davis, lead deputy in the investigation, with the Clackamas County Sheriff's office, stated that the incident is being investigated as a criminal case at this time. Blood samples have been taken and sent to the State Crime Lab in Salem for analysis.

The CRAFT team, "Crime Reconstruction and Forensic Team", is in charge of marking, measuring and



“Complete Communities” Update!

“Complete Communities” for Clackamas County is finished with its first phase and the initial findings are in.

The purpose of “Complete Communities” is to work together to define common and unique community values, identify the diverse attributes of “Complete Communities” and guide future policy decisions and actions.

A committed team of citizen volunteers, professional consultants and County staff has been on the road since Spring 2000, asking the question, “What does a complete community mean to you?”

For the past several months, “Complete Communities” has been discussed by citizens in every corner of the County in more than 70 neighborhood meetings, events and festivals.

More than 1,700 individuals participated in a random sample telephone survey, and more than 1,200 completed a written perceptionnaire. The findings from the community meetings, perceptionnaires and phone survey produced many issues of importance to County citizens, among them education, environmental quality, transportation, growth, and public safety.

These issues were discussed in detail by more than 50 citizens at the “Complete Communities Congress,” an all-day forum held at Oregon City High School on October 28, 2000. People came from all over the County bound together by an interest in making the community the best it can be.

Joining with people who shared similar interests, participants got down to work by discussing three questions:

- In the best of all worlds, describe your issue in Clackamas County.
- What actions are needed to realize our ideal?
- What are our top recommendations?

For more than 2 hours, the room buzzed with ideas, enthusiasm and creativity as strangers came together to find common answers to tough issues.

(Continued From Pg 2, Col 2- Complete Communities Update) Each group devised a set of possible recommendations to address its issue of interest. Recommendations were thoughtful and creative and there were many new ideas.

The work at the Congress produced dozens of strong recommendations that are being compiled into a report. The "Complete Communities" team will take this report back to individual communities for a final phase of citizen discussion from December through February.

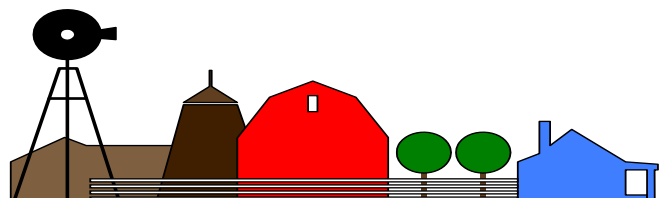

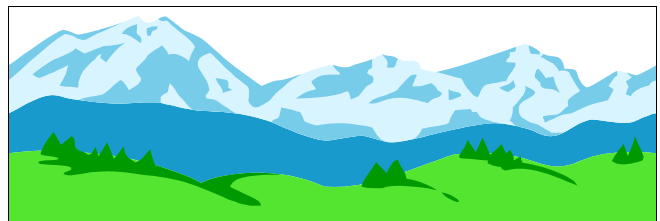

CPO Spotlight

The November meeting of the Beavercreek CPO was held on Wednesday, November 22, 2000, at the Beavercreek Grange on Kamrath Rd., at 7:00 p.m.

The guest speaker was Ron Weinman, Principal Transportation Planner, for Clackamas Co., who discussed the proposed long term improvements to Hwy 213 and Beavercreek Rd.

According to Mr Weinman, Beavercreek Rd is expected to be widened to 4 lanes between the Hwy 213 by-pass in Oregon City and Henrici Rd., and if in time growth warrants it, the road could be widened all the way up to Leland Rd., in the Beavercreek core area. This information did not sit too well with the members present and a discussion followed.

Several options were discussed including a center turn lane to facilitate the flow of traffic without the need to widen the highway to four lanes. Some members thought this might be a better way to go. It would also have less of an impact on the property owners along the stretch of highway.

How to control the speed of cars in the core area was also discussed, as well as the sharing of information regarding the head on collision of several weeks ago.

The next meeting of the CPO will occur on Wednesday, December 27, 2000, in the same location and at the same time. If you would like more information, please call 503-632-8370 and leave a message.

A meeting was held on November 27, 2000, and citizen input was given. The Planning Commission recommended that Beavercreek Rd., from Henrici Rd., to Leland be only 3 lanes not the proposed 4.

Also, the "Green Corridor," which was planned for Hwy 213, was recommended to be deleted from the Transportation System Plan.

On December 20, 2000, a Transportation Plan Board Hearing will be held at 902 Main St., in Oregon City, at 9:30 a.m. The Editor
