Susan McLain from the Metro Council was the guest speaker. Area 25 and its status for inclusion into the Urban Growth Boundary was discussed.

Dr. Kurt Schrader, our State Representative in the Legislature, also attended and addressed the members after the adjournment.

BCCP UPDATE

The BCCP has received word from Susan McLain, of the Metro Council, that area 25 (Tier II land) will not be brought into the Urban Growth Boundary this year. Ms. McLain shared that a low productivity score and the BCCP's involvement were instrumental in this result.
